This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. Curriculum Music: Part A

At Springfield Primary Academy we follow a curriculum which broadly echoes that of the model music curriculum (March 2021) but is developed to include up to date changes in the industry, teacher specialisms and equipment. To enhance lessons, the Charanga programme is used.

Our curriculum includes the following:

- 45-minute weekly lessons

- Performing/Instrumental Performance
- Class instrumental ensembles
- Song writing
- Improvisation

Extra- curricular musical opportunities are as follows:

Music Service Provision

- Elective classes for Years 5 & 6 an fully funded offer of high-quality instrumental tuition to allow progression from whole class lessons in Year 4.
- In groups, 20-30 minute, weekly opportunities for Years 5 & 6 pupils to learn to play the flute and clarinet.
- Free instrument loans via Music Service to ensure all children have the opportunity to learn regardless of circumstances.
- Opportunities for performances at the end of each year led by Music Service teacher.
- Opportunities for children to join free Music Service area ensembles.
